TENARKY District Winter Workshop

The annual Tenarky District Winter Workshop will be held in February 8-10, 2013, in Franklin, Tennessee. Speakers include:

- Baldo Villegas from California, a leading expert on rose insects and diseases. He will discuss the management of beneficial and harmful insects and fungal diseases of roses.
- Carol Shockley has been growing roses for 27 years. She is a Silver Medal Recipient and Outstanding Consulting Rosarian.
- Robbie Tucker is a nationally recognized amateur hybridizer of miniflora and miniature roses and the owner of Rosmania.com, an online source for many rose products.
- Whit Wells, of Wells Mid-South Roses, is well known for the many roses he has hybridized. Many of us grow his roses and

we have a category for his roses at our rose show.

- Dr. Mark Windham, UT professor, will discuss his research into Rose Rosette Disease and other projects such as identifying disease resistant varieties and mechanisms of roses.

In addition to the lectures and a panel discussion on Saturday, there is a Friday night welcome supper with speaker, Tom Stebbins, playing "Sherlock Holmes in the Rose Garden." He will offer "clues" for identifying roses pests, both insects and diseases." At the Saturday night banquet, Pat Shanley, ARS Vice President will be the guest speaker. Her topics if "A Rosy Future for Gardners and the Industry."

A New Source for Mini, Miniflora & Single Roses

During the early 1970's, Verlie Whitson Wells, Jr., began hybridizing roses and has been operating his rose business as Wells Mid-South Roses since that time. Whit, as he is universally recognized, has registered close to 100 roses and has several minifloras rated in the top 25 exhibition roses with several more knocking on the door. Whit is generally considered to be the Dean of Hybridizers today. The octogenarian Wells plans to continue his award winning hybridizing efforts for many more years. He is planning on entering two new roses in the AOE two year test.

For Love Of Roses, LLC was formed in 2013 for the purpose of acquiring the assets of Wells Mid-South Roses. Richard J. Anthony is a national level exhibitor with 100 Queens of Show to his credit after 11 years of exhibiting roses. He has 3 National Queens and 7 District Queens as of the Fall of 2012 rose season. He has teamed up with his longtime friend and mentor to form a close rose alliance concentrating on miniature and miniflora exhibition and garden roses. Richard plans to continue exhibiting, hybridizing and bringing great roses to old friends and new together with Whit. The mission statement found on their website states: "Wells Mid-South Roses has long been recognized for high quality exhibition miniature and miniflora roses. Our mission at For Love Of Roses, LLC and Wells Mid-South Roses is to provide the highest quality exhibition and garden rose available today to all rose growers throughout the continental United States. The best quality rose at a fair price is our goal."

Rose Tips for January & February by Noah Wilson, CR, Holston RS (TN)

Things I will be doing to my roses in January-February:

1. If for some reason I have not gotten my roses cut back to about five feet high I will do this now. I don't want the winter winds to rock my bushes back and forth and create an air pocket at the base where rain could fill in around the base of the bush and freeze, which will kill my plant.
2. I will also get my winter mulch around each plant about a foot high. This will protect my bush from any extreme freezes that may injure the bush or even kill it, especially in the early spring when new growth comes out. I leave this in place until I know extreme winter is over. I don't mind temperatures getting down to upper 20's, but not lower without this protection.
3. I will use this time to replace roses or order for spring arrival. I may transplant roses from one location to another now, also. Be sure to do this when temperatures are not too bitter cold, and be sure to mulch well after transplanting.
4. I will spray at least 2 or 3 times with a dormant spray like Lime Sulfur. This helps in killing the left over black spot spores from last season. Spray as directed on the container. Mine says 8 tablespoons per gallon water.
5. Spray the bush and soil well and spray the bed area some 6 feet out from the bush to be sure you get any spores dropped to the ground.
6. I will also take a soil test to be sure my pH is within the desired range of 6.0 to 6.5. You can use a meter of your own to do this or, get a soil sample and send it off to be read for you. The University of Tennessee has a kit for this available at the UT Agriculture Agents offices.
7. Now is a good time to reflect back on all you wanted to do to and for your roses, but did not get around to.
8. Make notes on next years rose growing to become a better rosarian
